Apps and Girls is an NGO founded in 2013 by Carolyn Ekyarisiima, that works to **bridge the tech gender gap** in Tanzania by **investing** in young **girls** to become **Tech drivers/leaders/role models** creating products and startups solving community challenges regardless of their age and gender.

To achieve our vision, Apps & Girls provides quality coding trainings in (web programming, mobile app development, game development) and entrepreneurship skills to girls of ages 10 to 18 year in respective schools where we create coding clubs. Every week our team conducts trainings in different coding clubs in schools. We also organize holiday events such as workshops, exhibitions, hackathons, Girls Code Camps, bootcamps and competitions where they pitch their developed projects to parents and the public so as to inspire more girls to pursue computing and to develop innovations. Apart from coding and pitching during these events the girls also groomed to live a healthy lifestyle and to learn how to use the skills gained to make a product & change the community.

Apps & Girls also provides **mentorship** and **incubation** to emerging **young female TECH entrepreneurs** and use our network to promote their work to customers, partners and potential funding opportunities. Furthermore Apps and girls trains **low income earning women** in **digital literacy** through its **Teknomama** project and creates awareness about the great capacity and potential of a girl to change the community through ICT.

1/ **Quality coding trainings** to young girls at school in Dar Es Salaam and to help them develop their own projects and succeed in their careers. We create coding clubs in selected schools where our team of volunteers conducts coding trainings in web programming, mobile app/ game development and entrepreneurship skills to girls aged 10-18 yrs.

2/ **Holiday Events** :Organize holiday events such as workshops, exhibitions, hackathons, Girls Code Camps, bootcamps and competitions to empower and inspire more girls to pursue computing and to develop innovations. During the annual competitions all girls participating are given a chance to present/pitch their respective projects to the jury and public. At the end of it, the winners are announced and are awarded. These competitions help our girls to be competitive and aggressive even in real life situations.

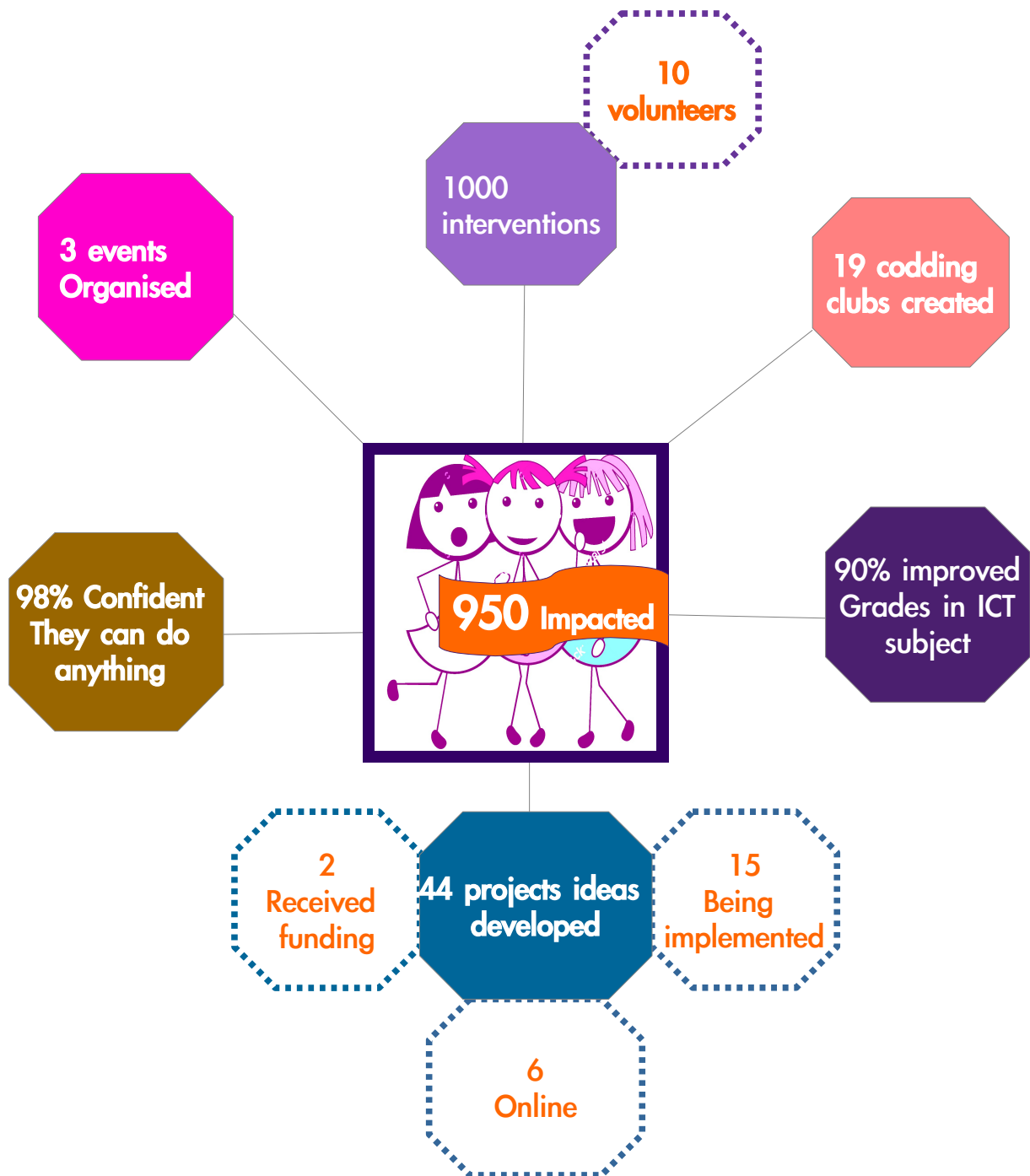
Apart from coding and pitching during these events the girls also are groomed to live a healthy lifestyle and to learn how to use the skills gained to make a productive change in the community.

Story of Zainabu the future programmer determined to CODE4CHANGE!

Zainabu is a 16 year old girl in grade four and goes to Jangwani girls secondary school in Dar es salaam. She lives with her grandmother who has been taking care of her from the time she was one year old, after the divorce of her parents.

Zainabu was lucky to join one of the most privileged public schools in Dar es salaam with a well equipped computer laboratory. So in her first year at Jangwani, she was selected randomly to do ICT as a subject, others were selected for French and others another subject, according to the school procedure. **As luck had it, she started her journey in ICT though she knew so little**, if not nothing, about it, because her dream was to become a pilot.

In June 2014, when we announced about an opportunity to attend a workshop in HTML in her school, and she attended. Surprisingly, despite her being laid back, she was able to master coding very fast that's when we first met when one of my volunteers mentioned "that gal is supper fast!".

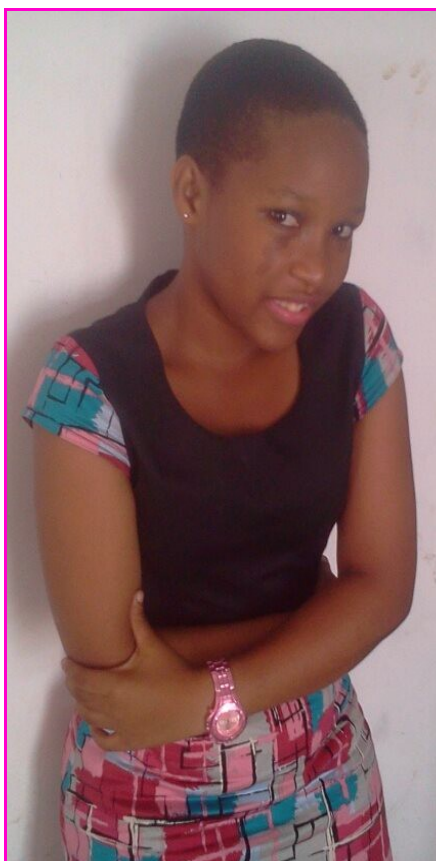
Zainabu is a silent girl and very keen on what ever she is working on. Later in august 2014, she joined Apps & Girls by default since she was in the ICT class.

Zainabu attended a few sessions with us at Apps & Girls and she was a quick learner, to the extent that she **started teaching her fellow students especially in coding**. Through our mentorship program, she formed a group with her team and chose a project idea to develop a website to promote tourism and culture in Tanzania . However the project was not successful because it had implementation challenges and a weak sustainability, so the group split up and she decided to go solo with a new idea, which we helped her to get. This new idea was called **MAONI box** (www.maonibox.com) which is a web-based system or on line system that enables clients/ customers to comment or rate the quality of a product or a service from different producers, manufacturers, companies and institutions.

Her 78 year old grandmother, who is a water vendor, managed to save 150000tsh for her from that business and she was able to finish and host her website. Due to the mentor-ship and sessions she has received from Apps & Girls , Zainabu's performance in ICT has greatly improved.

She was an average performer before joining Apps & Girls , with her grades being around 50%-60%, but currently her performance is excellent. Her lowest mark in ICT being 80% which is an A!

Her dream career has changed too, Zainabu now dreams to be a computer engineer and a programmer developing many applications solving community problems and generating income for her. Her career life has been tremendously changed and she excited about the future. She says the sky is no longer the limit to her! To top it all up, Zainabu is so far the **best coder** in Apps & Girls and **a peer educator** in the coding club in her school and at our incubator. Zainabu is very confident and believes in her self that she is going to achieve her dreams as a programmer and change many people's lives just like her role model Carolyne Ekyarisiima has and is still doing!



Winni the Nation Builder!

Winni is a 17-year-old girl just completed forth grade at Kisutu girls, a public secondary school in Dar es Salaam. The moment she heard the advert of the Apps and Girls web programming workshop in her school she curiously searched to learn more about apps and girls on facebook, that's when we first e_met,. She was very excited and looking forward to attending the workshop that's the time she expressed her passion for technology as we chatted though her dream career was to be a lawyer to protect human rights and help the defenceless. Like many girls, Winni didn't know how to use a computer and had hardly thought of running her own business. Though her father was a telecom engineer and mother a business lady. The only thing she could do was to use the drawing app for drawing the dad had installed.

During the web programming workshop in june 2014 attended by 100 girls at Buni hub, Winni was excited, curious to learn new things, and took the front seat. learning coding, and listening to the inspiration speech at the workshop motivated her more and she wrote to us expressing her great experience, it was obvious she wanted to build a better Tanzania though she didn't know what and how she was going to it.

August 2014 Winni joined and became president of our coding club at her school, she was among the fast girls who grabbed the computers first since they were limited and she coded as the fellows watched behind. She continued coming to our sessions and her passion and confidence were growing everyday that's when Fanikishamama project

was born. She joined our mentorship sessions with her project idea to provide fistula awareness among young girls and crowdfund for fistula victims seed income to help them improve their financial status and gain their dignity in their respective communities.

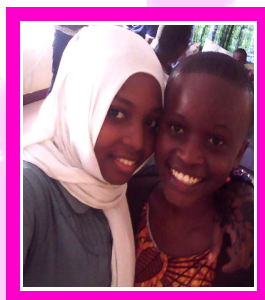
After attending just a few sessions, Winni created fanikishamama website and entered Apps&Girls Annual competition 2014, and out of 38 participants, she won the 1st prize with the project and was crowned ambassador of Apps and Girls 2015. In June 2015 she won the Reach for change Day of African child competition worth USD 500 to implement her project which is already available online. Winni is one among the girls who are helped to recruit and run the coding clubs in their respective schools and has helped her fellows to improve their pitching skills.

Winni has turned into an inspiring figure to both girls and women in Tanzania and has been invited several times to radio talks about ICT and youth employment also she was given a chance to share her story at the ITBootcamp of 100 university ladies organized by Help to Help organisation.

She also applied for the African Leadership Academy has made it to the few 9 finalists n Tanzania

“ I am confident that I can do and act on something and change lives of many people. Words have got so much power than anything! I can make a motivational speech anywhere now because of the courage that I have gained, i don't have to be Somebody to do something Amazing..i have the power to be or do what I want to be all it takes is to take action. The world evolves around technology so why not use technology to build a better Tanzania?” says Winni

Winni now stands as a role model for many girls especially in her school where many girls lookup to her and are inquisitive to know how she has managed to achieve all that . In the process of setting up her Organisation has made connections with 5 doctors at Muhimbili, CCBRT and Amana hospitals who are helping In the implementation of Fanikishamama. She now dreams to be a computer scientist.



Asha and Belinda won the chance to become Junior Members members of the New York Academy of Sciences. The Junior Academy is a virtual program for exceptional students interested in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM).They have gained access to an exciting community of student peers from across the globe, as well as mentoring from leading STEM practitioners. They have completed the 101 research and are now working on a food security project which they will compete with in the Food loss challenge to win cash prizes and an all expenses paid trip to New York City for a two-day summit.

Interview with Modesta Joseph, 16yrs a.k.a Tech_mode

1. How did you come up with OURCRIES.COM

I joined Apps and Girls coding Club in my school in 2014. In the club we were trained how to code and build software such as websites and also we had brainstorm sessions in which we had to identify various challenges which are found in our community/society so that we can take that opportunity by building a related/respectively website to solve it. I fell in love with coding and had a very big passion for it. I decided to go to the Apps and Girls foundation head office and continue studying coding trainings.

It was then Madam Carolyne, The founder of App sand Girls gave me a homework of “brainstorming about the problem that appear in my society which I would like to solve And that is when OUR CRIES was born..I didn't go far thinking of a problem because I was also facing a real problem which is Students harassments: Being a student in Dar es Salaam Tanzania and mostly day scholar student is a big hustle. There are many challenge facing students. As a victim of harassments and humiliations which are from the bus conductors and drivers to us “students” . I decided to raise my voice in this sector. Therefore when you try to look in deep it's the experience, feelings and my “mtazamo” I had towards the the problem(students harassments). I was hurt (experience), I didn't like the situation (feelings) and yet I felt that it wasn't right!

2. Why did you chose to do that?

As a social entrepreneur you are different, I think we all mostly do things driven by our passion, dreams and responsibilities .For me I was driven with my dream and passion.I had a dream: Ever since I was young I wanted to do something that would benefit my community and as fulfilling my dream it was the reason to choose going with our cries as I help my fellow students to get rid of this evil. **My passion:** For the just few days Carolyne trained me I knew it was from her heart I really needed to be like her and she is still my role model.



3. How does it operates?

Our Cries gives/provide voice and opportunity for voiceless students to report harassments, humiliations and abuses(CRIES) they face from bus operators when using public transit. And later all those reported incidences are forwarded to SUMATRA (Surface and Marine Transport Regulatory Authority) for further action. Students can report their cries through a web based system . And for those who do not have an access to internet they can report through normal SMS and Our Cries Boxes. Our Cries boxes are boxes made from wood which will be placed in several secondary schools so as for students to submit their cries on paper. The cries collected through OURCRIES BOXES AND SMS later still will be entered in the System by data entrants. Also the system has started a petition to end all these cries , sign the petition and end student's cries

4. What challenges did you /still face?

After developing our cries website I participated in APPS AND GIRLS ANNUAL COMPETITION IN 2014 in which I was the third one. After I won that award I got free hosting for my website. I kept asking myself WHATS NEXT?!! Yes the website is up but there was no marketing, No potential tools to work on the project such as laptop actually I had no money for implementation. But regarding my business model ,I started

applying for competitive funds ..Its where I applied for TANZICT INNOVATION FUND and thank got I got the fund.

CURRENT CHALLENGES: It's the basic Our Cries business model. When you have a Social business you really need to have a sustainable and promising business model so as to survive rather than depending on donation and fundings.The same with Our Cries,Our basic business model is really potential but not promising. And after thinking hard on that me and my team we had come up with several ideas to replace the current basic business model but none of them mostly fit so we are still discussing on that. Also another Challenge is SUMATRA, Sumatra is delaying to respond to us when we should have our final meeting or you can call it discussion so we can start implementing.

5. What is happening so far?

First of all We are in the final stages of registering it as an NGO and also we are in the last step of finalizing our partnership with SUMTRA . Secondly, Our Cries has been able to receive more than a hundred cries from students.Thirdly, we are securing/creating more partnerships with schools here in Dar es Salaam for Our Cries boxes,and conducting User trainings on how to use the system.

Forth: Implemeting our new marketing strategy to reach more students (fb ads,radio free airtime, inschool seminars, flyers and brochures and posters etc



Modestar is a young star aged 16 years, goes to Kisutu secondary school. She is first born in her family with one sibling and has turned into a role model to many girls. She has attracted many girls to start coding whom she teaches at her school once a week.

MODESTA has won different competitions such as the Innovation fund by TANZICT and COSTECH, Pitch competition to attend SLUSH2015 in finland and Apps and girls annual competition 2014.

She has been invited several times to talk about her innovation and achievements, on youth TV shows and radio talks , Modesta also got a chance to share her story with 100 university women at the Help to Help IT bootcamp. Media like the citizen news paper, Daily mail UK, embassy of finland blog, Apps and girls blog and the dream website-sweden have featured her story!

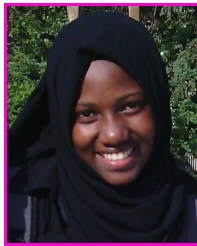


Kokubanza January, 16 yrs

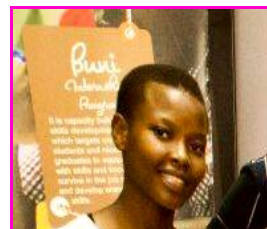

Girls Code Camp June 2015

June 2015 we had our very first camp where 10 girls from different private and public secondary schools participated. Girls stayed in the selected place for five days and they were learning intensive coding and pitching skills. This gave girls the chance to learn more and practice since most of them didn't get that chance to do it at school and also don't have computers at their home. The event ended well and some students were able to finish their project within five days.

Girls Code Camp December 2015

On December 2015, We organized our second camp where 30 girls from 9 different schools attended, this event was of success because quarter of girls who attended were from schools which we Apps and girl's don't operate. This event was somehow different from that of June since girls were able to learn new skills including hardware, Database and Mobile app. We went further and helped two of the projects from Apps and Girls products (AuraTeen and #Beware) to organize their first events (Cervical cancer Awareness event and SEx education event). NB: All these two Camps were supported fully by students' parents, and Nlab team, we really appreciate they believe in our mission and vision that we can shape their children and make them think out of the box.

Grand Competition

2015 ended with an annual competition which helped us to get our new ambassador ! The event was done at BuniHub - Sayansi Kijitonyama. Girls pitched their projects they have been developing before and after joining the Camp. We had 30 girls from 9 different schools, 26 projects were pitched to the jury which selected the best three projects.

1st position we had **OUTPEAK** presented by Necta Richard, 16 yrs from Jangwani Girls sec school who became Apps and Girls ambassador for the year 2016,. OutPeak is a crowd-fund website that helps needy children to fundraise for school fees and scholastic materials.

2nd position was **CCA[Cervical Cancer Awareness]** by MaryLucy Asenga 17yrs from Marian Girls School. Her website helps to create awareness among young girls and ladies about cervical cancer and how well they can prevent it. It also has an online booking system for the patients to easily access medical services.

3rd position was **CCCS (Climate change cyber school)** by Queen Mtega 16yrs, from Athena Girls Secondary School . Her project educates the public about climate change and best practices to reduce deforestation and air pollution.

Zainabu Omary from Jangwani became **Best Coder** of all time after being selected by her fellow coders in the program. The criteria of getting the best coders based on sharpness of the person on learning, and willingness to help others when they are stuck with coding.

People's choice Award:

Also we had people's choice award which was launched on October 2015. People from all over were asked to read posted projects and choose one which according to their understanding can have great impact on the community and **Asha from Kibasila** became the first with the highest votes followed by **Fatma from Kibasila** become the second and **Elham from Zanaki** became the third.

All winners were awarded small seed income and sponsorship of one year website hosting and the top 10 finalist were also awarded 6months free website hosting by Apps & Girls.



Strong sustainability model

This year's main focus is to make Apps & Girls fully sustainable so that we can continue to comfortably create impact. We are currently working on improving previous and the new income generating activities and setting up IT (hardware & software) consulting services.

Strong Communication

To achieve this years goals we are strengthening our communications and branding so that we make Apps & Girls TOM (Top of Mind) of every stakeholder and potential supporters.

Protégées graduation

2nd April 2016, we will celebrate the great work and achievements of some of the girls in the program who have successfully developed, piloted and are now on the road to implementing their projects. So its graduation! Where they will be moving to our incubator program "TechieZ"

Girls In ICT Day

26th April 2016, In partnership with ITU we will celebrate Girls In ICT Day, a global event that happens every year to inspire more girls into ICT.

Technovation Challenge Regional Pitch

15 girls in our program are participating in Technovation Challenge 2016, Apps & Girls being the regional ambassador, we will organise the Official regional Pitch event.

Launch Girls Tech Hub/lab

We have secured a room to use a Girls Tech Hub/lab at Kisutu girls school, after we have secured all resources necessary it will officially be launched OPEN!

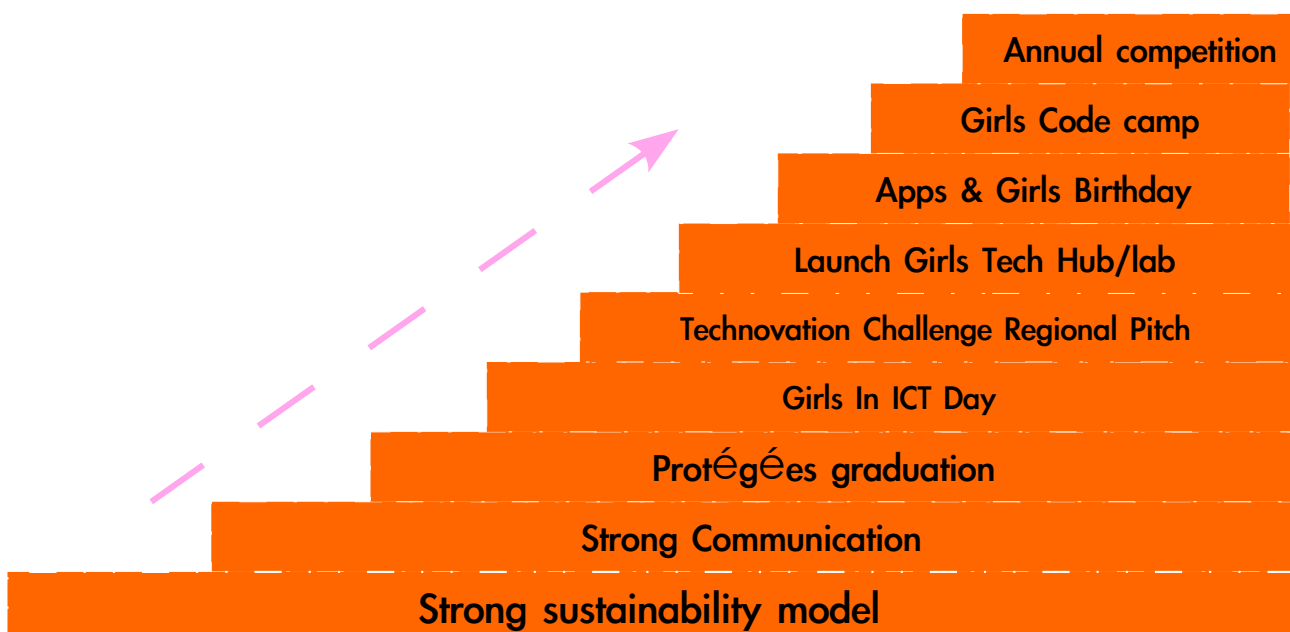
